Chocolate Simplicity Cake

3 tablespoons butter 2 level tablespoons cocoa ½ cup milk 1 cup sugar pinch salt 1 cup S.R. flour 2 eggs

Melt butter place all other ingredients in a large mixing bowl. Pour the melted butter over the ingredients and beat hard for 3 minutes. Place mixture in a suitable cake tin and bake in a moderate oven for approximately 25 minutes. When cool ice with chocolate icing.
